


## Adding Your Specialisations


Go to My PRII and [Edit profile](#).



In the Edit Profile selection, this specific page is your private information.

Scroll down to **Specialisation** and click into the box. A menu should appear like as in the below graphic, and you will be able to select your own specialisations.
